
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#### Chapter Meetings

Vice President: Fills in for and assists the president as needed. Per BCHA they are supposed to help report chapter members activity to national (this is computerized now and super easy).

**Secretary:** Prepares the monthly meeting minutes and sends them to the newsletter editor for publishing.

Treasurer: Collect member dues, pays all bills and reports the financial status at monthly meetings.

The newsletter editor is an appointed position. If someone has interest and expertise with writing newsletters, please let an officer know.

Our chapter has about 65 memberships; some are new – many have years of experience.
