Current Membership Roster provided. Financial report from November: \$12,455.86 is in our CFOV account; Checking is \$7,835.03, Ski tickets from Holiday Auction/Banquet brought in \$400. Total proceeds of \$1880.00 from Holiday Auction. Match Grant is all year long.
