



Ride #082 - Trailhead

Directions to the trailhead starts at Jct Hwy 191 & Hwy 313
Go West on Hwy 313 about 2.3 miles, Look for a 16' Gate on left
As you turn off of Hwy 313 you will cross a cattle guard.
The Trailhead is 100 feet off of Hwy 313

Ride #082—Description

The "[Seven Mile Canyon](#)" ride is an easy 8.4 mile ride.
The canyon starts off fairly wide and narrows as you get near the Groto.
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be warm but there is some protection in the canyon.
Several Rock-Art drawings can be found in this canyon.



Ride #081 - Trailhead

Directions to the trailhead starts at Jct Hwy 191 & Hwy 313
Go North on Hwy 191 about 4.4 miles, Look for Mill Canyon Road
As you turn off of Hwy 191 you will cross an RxR.
There is a Kiosk about .6 miles in, stay left, go another .4 miles
The trailhead & campground is about 1 mile from Hwy 191

Ride #081—Description

The "[Mill Canyon](#)" ride is an easy 6 mile ride.
The ride can be started in either Mill or Courthouse Canyons.
Motorized is not allowed in either canyon for the 1st two miles.
After riding the canyons there is a large slick rock area to ride.
Uranium Arch is in this area, it adds 4 miles to the ride.
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be warm but there is some protection in the canyons.



Ride #079 - Trailhead

Directions to the trailhead starts at Jct Hwy 191 & Hwy 313
Go West on Hwy 313 about 8.5 miles, Look for Lone Mesa sign on the right
After you turn off of Hwy 313 you will go 1/4 mile and turn right
The Trailhead is a 1/4 mile in on the Lone Mesa Campground road

Ride #079—Description

The "[Wipeout Hill](#)" ride is an easy 7 mile ride.
The ride heads North-East from Hyw 313
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be hot, not any protection.
The views on this ride are of the red rocks & La Sal mountains.
Some slick rock but mostly sandy 4x4 roads.
You will encounter some off-road vehicles on this ride.



Ride #096 - Trailhead

Directions to the trailhead starts at South Side Shell, Hwy 191
Go South on Hwy 191 about 16.4 miles, Look for Gas Plant on right
The turn off is on the right, 1/4 mile past the Gas Plant
After you turn off of Hwy 191 you will go 1.5 miles and cross a cattle guard
The Trailhead parking is on left just as you cross the cattle guard.

Ride #096—Description

The "[Flat Iron Mesa](#)" ride is an easy 10 mile ride.
The canyon starts off fairly wide and narrows as you get further South.
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be warm but there is some protection in the canyon.



Ride #099 - Trailhead

Take Hwy 191 about 3 miles North from Moab.
Directions to the trailhead starts at Jct Hwy 191 & Hwy 128
Go East on Hwy 128 about 20 miles, Look for Onion Creek Campground
Turn right off of Hwy 128 and go about 1 mile
Here there is a Kiosk on your left, Campsite has a large loop

Ride #099—Description

The "[Onion Creek Canyon](#)" ride is an easy 10 mile ride.
The canyon starts off fairly wide and narrows as you get further South.
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be warm but there is some protection in the canyon.
WARNING: Beware of flash floods. Know the weather if you ride the creek.



Ride #095 - Trailhead

Directions to the trailhead starts at Jct Hwy 191 & Hwy 313
Go North on Hwy 191 about 6.1 miles, Look for Blue Hills road on the Left
After you turn off of Hwy 191 you will go 2.3 miles and turn Left
The Trailhead is in .8 miles at a 3 way junction (Mill Canyon road)

Ride #095—Description

The "[Bartlett & Pickle Canyons](#)" ride is an easy 7 mile ride.
The canyon starts off fairly wide and narrows as you get further South.
It is a beautiful ride especially during the spring and fall.
Summer can be warm but there is some protection in the canyon.
Pickle Canyon is at the middle of the ride and is a narrow slot canyon.
You probably will encounter some motorized traffic here but its worth it
